Winter Wonderland

Friends of Trowell school ran the Christmas wonderland event and raised £750, which is going towards their project of building a new play area for the school. The cost of this is a little over £10,000 and thanks to the success of the Christmas event they are half way there the evening was so successful they have agreed to do it again next year.

There was a good variety of stalls from both local businesses and community groups ranging from raffles, cake stalls, hot food, mulled wine and children's activities including face painting. Santa was in attendance and Trowell school choir also performed on the night. A good time was had by all.

Upcoming events include a pamper evening in April, a fashion show in May and a summer fair in July.

HS2 & Trowell

We as your Parish Council are opposed to the route of HS2 through this village.

If the proposed route is used the M1 southbound carriage way will become part of the track, the northbound carriageway will become the southbound carriageway, and a new northbound carriageway will be constructed. A viaduct, potentially 65 feet high will cross the A6007 Stapleford Road, in the vicinity of the M1 road bridge. This will continue to the A609 Nottingham Road, crossing the road on an elevated bridge, all of this work starts many years before track is laid and the trains run.

The Parish Council on your behalf has completed the consultation document stating our reasons for amendments to the proposed route. We have asked them to consider an alternative to the viaduct, we've discussed our concerns at a private meeting with Anna Soubry MP, who shares our concerns. She has offered her assistance, an offer we will take up.

We need to have the village recognised as a rural area as opposed to an urban area; secure compensation for all householders affected by the project, obtaining changes to the route that keeps disruption to the village minimal. The Parish Council will continue to work on your behalf to achieve the best result for the village.
